WHAT IS DISC GOLF?

Disc golf is played much like traditional golf. Instead of a ball and clubs, however, players use a flying disc, similar to a Frisbee®.

RULES OF DISC GOLF

The object of the game is to complete each hole in the fewest number of throws. To begin, the disc is thrown from the tee area toward the target, which is a metal basket with chains. As a player progresses down the fairway, he or she must make each consecutive shot from the spot where the previous throw has landed. The trees, shrubs, and terrain changes located in and around the fairways provide challenging obstacles for the golfer. Once the disc has landed in and around the fairways provide challenging obstacles for the golfer. Once the disc has landed in the basket, the hole is completed. Count the total number of throws, plus any penalties, and proceed to the next hole. At the end of the course, the player with the fewest total throws is the winner.

Hole distances and par are listed on the sign for each hole.

OUT-OF-BOUNDS: all paved areas and beyond (example: your shot lands on pavement or crosses pavement and lands in area beyond). Out-of-bounds violations require a one-stroke penalty. Player throws from spot where disc entered out-of-bounds area.

ALSO...

Allow faster players to play through. Take pride in your course. Keep it clean. Place all trash in trash cans. Pick up litter as you see it. Do not mark on or otherwise abuse the baskets or signs. Do not allow anyone else to do so. Do not allow children to climb on baskets. With proper treatment, this disc golf course and its components will last for many years. Report all acts of vandalism to police or park officials. This is a multi-use park. Please treat all disc golfers as well as other park patrons with respect. Disc golfers should allow hikers and other pedestrians to clear the area before throwing.
