#### 1 Chautauqua Nature Trail

Trail Head Chautauqua Refuge Headquarters.

**Description** This rocked trail takes you on a leisurely walk through the woods with three beautiful decks overlooking the South Pool. This is the oldest and most frequented trail at the refuge with great wildlife viewing and an ADA accessible path.

An ADA accessible 0.5 mile loop.

### 2 Roundtree Trail

Trail HeadNorth and South Roundtree parking lots: 1950E,<br/>.8 miles north of Eagle Bluffs

 
 Description
 This trail takes you through Roundtree Natural Area, an example of a typical Black Oak/ Mockernut Hickory forest type. Good opportunities for mushroom and berry picking.

 Length
 An easy 0.6 mile loop with two parking lots.

### 3 South Beer-can Trail

Trail Head North Roundtree parking lot

- **Description** Named for the ring of beer cans marking a secret birding hotspot, the trail takes you along the bluff of the North Pool to rarely seen areas of the refuge. A reduced understory makes this hike perfect for viewing migratory song-birds.
- Length An easy 0.5 mile one way walk. Connects with North Beer-can Trail at northern end.

### 4 North Beer-can Trail

Trail Head Goofy Ridge parking lot

- **Description** A ridge line trail that dips and rises along the ravines of the upper North Pool. A good portion of the trail follows the existing fire line for easy viewing of the canopy. Make sure to watch for trail markers.
- Length A moderately difficult 1.25 mile hike. Connects with South Beer-can trail at southern end.


### 5 North Pool Trail

Trail Head Eagle Bluff boat launch area and North Roundtree parking lot.

Description This trail winds up the eastern bluff of the North Pool. A cool breeze from the lake makes this hike enjoyable in hot summer months. Look for remnants of the fishing cabins that once dotted the bluff.
